## Vice President's Report

Although still hampered by the effects of COVID-19 across the country, Season 2020/21 saw much achieved, both on and off the beach for Quinns Mindarie SLSC and our members.

With significant capital works undertaken in season 2019/20 to develop the Club's amenities, the focus this year has been on operations, future planning and upgrading of equipment. Highlights include:

- Working with Member for Burns Beach, Mark Folkard, to secure \$57,500 from the State Government to upgrade key lifesaving equipment
- Securing a new IRB hull and motor to support training and patrols
- Purchase of new boards and surf skis to support Youth and Senior Surf Sports competitors
- Purchase of new Nipper boards to support training and competition
- Purchase of new equipment for the Woodside Nippers program
- New sun-smart shirts for members, delivering a stronger brand and sense of unity at competitions and during Club activities
- Trial and subsequent purchase of a modern Point of Sale system and related financial systems and applications, ensuring greater flexibility for member purchases and improved financial management and reporting across the Club

We began work on a 5–10-year strategy, gathering input from members to develop a strategy that retains lifesaving services at its core and provides a solid foundation for our Club's growth, while recognizing the value of mutuality and diversity in meeting the needs and wants of members. Thanks to a grant from the City of Wanneroo the Board was able to engage

a consultant to assist with the development of the strategic plan. This work will continue into season 2021/22 as we finalise the strategy, link in operational plans and expand our governance structure and practices. Thank you to all those who took the time to complete the survey, participate in group discussions or provide their feedback by other means. Your input is highly valued and greatly appreciated.

Thank you to our Club Officers across directorates for their passion and commitment to delivering another stellar season for members.

A special mention to Director of Lifesaving, Jim Gail, his management team and our cohort of Bronze Medallion and SRC holders for 'flying the red and yellow' on the beach and in the community. In addition to patrolling Quinns Beach, they supported the State Government's abalone season, helping to ensure the safety of thousands of abalone fishers on our coast; and guaranteed the success of the 2021 Marina Swim event at Mindarie Marina, delivering comprehensive water safety for hundreds of competitors.

Thanks also to Director of Youth, Sean Whitehead, and his team for the development of a compelling Youth offer this season that saw excellent participation from our young people across a range of activities and for delivering a highly successful Woodside Nippers program. The feedback from parents and participants regarding both programs was fantastic.

And to Director of Surf Sports, Jo Rigby, and her team whose outstanding efforts, and reinvigorated coaching programs, saw the Club achieve medals at State and National Championships and strong participation across carnivals at all levels.

Thank you to my fellow Board Members for the countless hours and steadfast commitment to their roles this past season. I would especially like to thank those who have delivered over a number of seasons and who have now chosen to pursue alternative Club interests and provide

other members with an opportunity to join the board; Saxon France, Jim Gail, Lea Gold, Caelee France and Jo Rigby, thank you for all you have done for our Club and members this past season and seasons prior.

I would also like to thank those members who stepped up to take on a board position, their perspectives and ideas have been welcomed and appreciated by the Board and members alike; thank you Paul Brownrigg, Lee Kemp, Sean Whitehead and Richard Lissett.

All in all, Season 2020/21 was a successful one for Quinns Mindarie SLSC. However, as in previous seasons, we again struggled to fill key positions and subcommittees this season. ## Administration Report

The 2020/21 season has been a busy one for the Club Administration team. We have had changes in key roles as well as introducing both process and system improvements to support the Club as it develops and grows.

After working tirelessly for over 7 years in the role of Club Administrator. Patricia Cren left the role to pursue full time employment in her other job. I would like to thank Patricia for all her hard work and dedication over the last 7 years.

I would also like to welcome Catherine Maloney-Ross to the Administration team. Cath has been around the Club for years, helping in other key Officer roles such as, Fundraising Manager and Social Manager before taking on the role of Club Administrator.

This season we have managed to finalise updates to the Club By-laws, aligning these with the updated Constitution. These updated By-laws support the direction, development and growth of the Club and incorporate a revised Organisational Structure which includes some new Officer positions needed for a growing Club.

This year the Club has also been awarded its own Charitable Collections License which allows the Club to collect money or goods for a charitable purpose. This license gives us more autonomy when fundraising and allows the Club to fundraise under its own name rather than being dependent on SLSWA license.

Working alongside the Director of Finance the Administration team have supported the implementation of a new cloud-based accounting system and we have been improving our administrative processes to align accordingly to the new system and financial processes.

Technology plays a key role in any organisation including Surf Clubs. This season we have also progressed improvements in our use of Information Technology (IT). The Club has

entered into an agreement with Google under their Google for Non-profits offering. This provides the Club (free of charge) access to Google's suite of Applications and moves things like email, electronic document storage, calendars and much more into the cloud.

As part of the Google offering the Board of Directors and the Club Administrator have all moved to new email addresses which are more closely aligned to the Club's name and improves our professional image. This offering also allows us to create additional email addresses for other key Club Officers, so watch this space for the coming season.

Further effort has been put into the Club's website, making sure the information and content is up to date and meaningful to both the community and our members. We will continue to make improvements into next season with an aim to improve the usefulness of the site and increase its usage. We encourage all members to regularly checkout the site as we start introducing new information and functionality, such as an events calendar and an online merchandise store.

Improved usage of the Club website forms part of our overall strategy to improve Club communication. We will continue to evolve our use of IT to support this and early next season you will see us making changes to our Member email communications.

I'd like to thank the current Board of Directors for their support this season as well as the commitment and support from all the Club Officers and Members that volunteered their time to make this season a massive success and a great foundation for the coming season.

During the year, the Board has spent a considerable amount of time strengthening the Club's financial processes and I believe this will result in far more transparency in how the Club is managed financially moving forwards. In conjunction with this we upgraded our accounting system to a more collaborative, cloud-based system, and we joined the 21st century by implementing a "point of sale and payments handling system". After a couple of seasons of major capital investments, namely the tractor and the new bar and gym, this year has seen a broader set of expenditures some of which you will have seen over the year and may well be highlighted in other portfolio reports (lifesaving equipment, gym equipment, boards and skis, etc.).

The Club remains in a strong financial position and the Board's focus has been to return value to the members across all the portfolios in a sustainable manner that is aligned with our long-term strategic view.

I'm always happy to discuss any specific financial items directly with the members.

## Lifesaving Report



Here we are having completed another busy patrol season complete. The club has yet again increased its capacity to provide surf lifesaving services for Quinns Beach, adjacent waters, and adjoining reefs.



With 112 returning patrol members (up from 100 the previous season) and a few additional experienced patrol members stepping up to take on the Patrol Captain and Vice Captain positions, we were able to put on one additional patrol team this season, increasing the number of teams to 15 which had the flow on effect of reducing patrol obligations by one less patrol for each patrolling member. This season we added an additional 23 Bronze Medallion (13 new to patrols) and 21 Surf Rescue Certificate holders to the ranks of our patrolling members.



With the additions to the patrol members and a few sadly leaving our ranks, we ended the season with a patrolling membership to 140.



This year also saw the limited introduction of dedicated First Aiders on patrol. This role has been discussed at different levels of surf lifesaving over the past several years and has yet to be formalised on a state level.

This initial introduction was primarily to retain existing BM patrol members who, as the result of recovery periods from surgeries and injury, were unable to complete their BM requalification but possess the skillsets and qualifications to provide patrol support in the areas of first aid, surveillance, and other beach specific activities.

As a result of the success of this, the requirements of the first aid position will be formalised over the coming months and offered to members who wish to become involved/remain involved with the lifesaving aspects of the Club but have reservations about being able to complete the requirements to obtain their bronze medallion.

As a Club we ended the season with a recorded 8 rescues - 4 of which were associated with our involvement in the surveillance of abalone fishing sessions, 50 first aid cases during patrol hours – 3 of which were during abalone patrol, and 93 preventive actions.

To highlight the impact our patrolling members, have in our community, in addition to first aid cases during patrol hours, our members were also involved with the treatment of members of the public, in the vicinity of the club, outside patrol hours on a recorded 9 occasions – 3 of which resulted in the person transported by ambulance to hospital for further treatment.

In addition to our scheduled patrol commitments, two of our members – CJ Van der Westhuizen and Richard Lissett - were highly commended when called upon to assist WAPOL in the search for a missing fisherman. These members mobilised an IRB in the early hours of the morning to assist in a search of the waters off Yanchep for a fisherman who fell from his boat the previous day. Although the fisherman did not survive the mishap, our members were instrumental in the recovery of the person – providing closure for the family and helping to further the reputation for surf life saving for being there when called.

Volunteer support for the abalone patrols was at its highest levels yet! With an average of 19 members on each patrol (44 members

volunteered overall) we had the fishing area well and truly covered.

As stated above, we recorded 4 rescues (Cerys Chiappa, Hayley Tilbury and Cale Symons) and 3 first aid cases (Fin Elward and Deb Allen) over the course of the 5, one hour sessions this abalone season.



It was also great to see that, along with being able to mobilise 2 IRBs for each session, we had the jet ski back in operation for each of the sessions - as the result of efforts by Jonny Massey and Nic Hall in the off season.

A welcome addition to the abalone patrols this season was the supply of gloves and reef shoes to the club by SLSWA through the grant from the Recreational Fishing Initiatives Fund. Many thanks to all the volunteers who came down in the early hours of a Saturday morning to support these patrols.



For the first time, we were in a position to provide support for the Marina Swim held at Mindarie Marina. In December 2020, we were approached by Swimming WA (the new organisers of the event) to provide 2 IRBs, 10 water based board paddlers, and 2 first aid personnel to act as water safety for the events. In putting out the call for volunteers, a massive 25 members put their hands up enabling us to provide the water safety and first aid needed as well as shore-based spotters for over 400 participants. In all we assisted 2 swimmers that needed help during the race. Again many thanks to the patrolling members who helped out with this event.

As for individual patrol statistics, following is the rankings of the 15 patrol teams as a ratio of rostered patrol hours vs patrol hours actually recorded - an individual's recorded patrol time starts when they report to the patrol area and stops when they finish their patrol duties for the day. This captures the teams who members are arriving early to check equipment in preparation for their patrol or staying back to ensure everything is cleaned, replenished, and packed away ready for the next patrol. It also captures patrols whose members arrange substitutes in the event they are unable to attend.

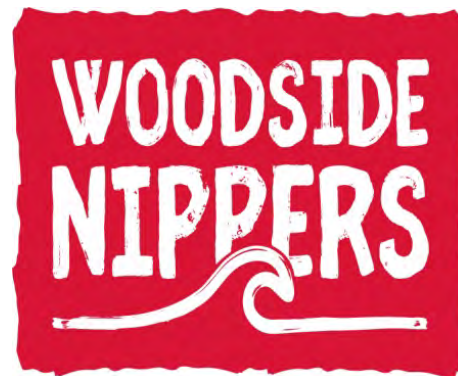
I would like to thank our Woodside Nippers and parents for embracing the ‘Challenge for All’

## House Report

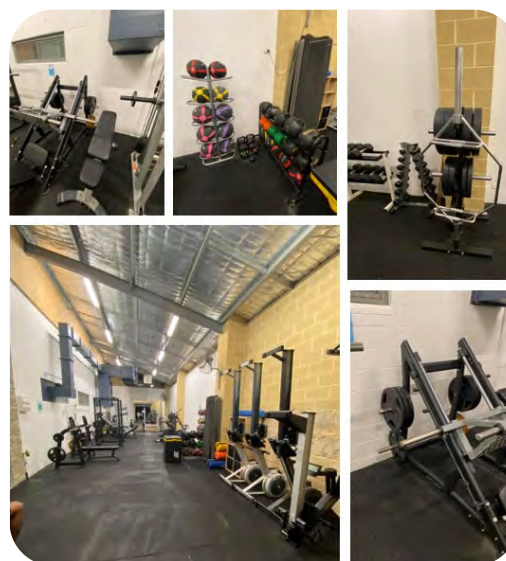
