# President's Report

2018/19 has been another Fantastic Season for our Club. We continue on an upward trend. This has been an exciting time for me to step into the role on behalf of an enthusiastic, positive and growing Membership.

All of the Club's Key Performance Indicators show positive signs; Membership numbers, Finances, Education, Competition, Social Activity and the area that is our Key Charter, Surf Life Saving. In the future, this season may well be seen as a watershed year when QMSLSC stood on the steps of a new and even more exciting Club.

We introduced the new position of Director of Marketing and Publicity to assist with the evolution. We expanded the Nipper groups to include U/6 in our cohort and a new Accounting and Financial Reporting system was introduced with the guidance and ongoing support of an independent bookkeeper. The Social Scene was very active providing many 'member free' activities. Senior and junior competition numbers were impressive, especially the number of qualifiers and achievements at the State Junior and Masters State Championships and Senior representation at the Aussie Championships. But most importantly, our presence on Quinns Beach has improved with the increase in Patrol numbers and the addition of a Patrol Observation Tower.

The Board of Management, in the meantime, were continuing to work in the background to prepare the Club for the

current season and for the challenges of the years ahead. Following changes to legislation we introduced a new Constitution to the membership. The dedicated efforts of the Board and support of SLSWA resulted in the ratification by the Membership. We await acknowledgement from the Department of Commerce before adopting the new Constitution.

Thanks to the diligent management of the current and previous Boards, the Club is in a sound financial position and ready to advance. At the start of the season, Duncan Gemmell commenced a review of our wardrobe and clothing design. A new Club towel with distinctive design was the start of the process. A major review of current stock and apparel is in process with the potential of a new look on Quinns Beach for all Members next season.

It is fundamental that we also nurture the social side of Membership. With that in mind there is a proposal afoot to re-organise the layout of Club facilities and improve the social offering for Members.

The Club's primary Charter is to provide Surf Life Saving operations on behalf of the City of Wanneroo. It is essential therefore that we supply a high standard of frontline service. The new Patrol Observation Tower is part of that quality offering. We are always looking at how else we can improve quality and safety. Education and continual development of our Life Savers is a mainstay. This year we also undertook a review of Beach Access to assist with the safe delivery/retrieval of both Nipper and Life Saving equipment.

Surf Life Saving WA (or State Centre) has been a strong supporter for the Board and Quinns Club this season and we are very grateful for their guidance. They must see that we are on the cusp of great things in the WA Surf Life saving scene. Our Board

are as excited as SLSWA and I must thank my fellow Directors, Neville Hogan, Bruce Westerman, Mike Harrington, Andrew Morgan, Lea Gold, Nathan Smith, Nathaniel Lee, Peter Larkin and Duncan Gemmell.

Without our Members we would not have a Club. Thank you to ALL Club officers, volunteers and parents for your contributions.

For continuing support, I would also like to thank our Patron John Quigley, MLA Attorney General, especially for funding the Observation Tower, Vice Patron Mayor Tracey Roberts for your continued work through Council and Vice Patron Mark Folkard MLA for providing the ice making machine for our Life Savers.

# Vice-President Reports

Quinns Mindarie SLSC goes from strength to strength each year. This year alone, we had just under 700 members enrolled, a record number doing Bronze Medallion and other awards through the education department, a fantastic numbers competing at carnivals from Nippers to Masters, as well as a team who competed at the Aussies 2019. Our success at these carnivals will be documented in the surf Sports Report.

Our long awaited Observation Tower was finally installed and has made a huge difference for our patrolling members. It will be dismantled this May but be erected again in September. We are currently negotiating with the City of Wanneroo over next summer to leave it up.

We have also been looking at fixing the problem with the UTE getting bogged while towing the trailer off the beach. We have trialled a tractor which is very easy to use, does not have to travel at speed while towing and can also tow the trailer easily. The tractor has a dual purpose: the one we are looking at will have a rake and a grader blade. The rake will be used first up on Sunday morning to clean up any seaweed or rubbish which will free up a lot of Nippers' parents from raking the beach and the grader blade can level off any uneven areas and keep the ramp free.

We also applied for a St John Grant for a defibrillator and received it. It will be mounted externally at the club for the club and public to use as a First Aid responder.

There is still a list to do at the club with reorganising of our storage area, opening up the existing gym area to a social area

and moving the gym out to the board shed and opening up the outside BBQ area for members to use. To do all this, we need your help! We have a lot of members in the club but we need more to participate in all aspects of the running of the club. Please come along to the AGM, to our social events and/or to our busy bees and get involved. The club is in the best position it has ever been in both membership numbers and financially. The board has made sure that all facets of the club are catered for and will continue to re-invest to grow our fantastic Surf Lifesaving Club.

Thank you to Patricia Cren who does a fantastic job with all our administration, keeping our club running efficiently.

# Education Report

It has been another big year in the education area for Quinns Mindarie Surf Life Saving Club.

As well as our annual skills maintenance (requalification) sessions where our entire Bronze medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Inflatable Rescue Boat Driver, Inflatable Rescue Boat Crew members were put their paces to maintain their skills, we were very busy training members to get various new qualifications.

Nipper Rescue Certificate was introduced last year but the intake fell short of numbers required to help with water safety. Hopefully we can turn this around and get more members involved and have the parents help with the water safety requirements for the nipper program. Big thanks to Saxon France for organising and running this course.

Drone operators training and mentoring continued successfully this season with more members signing up for the next intake. As our qualified drone pilot numbers increase, we can increase the number of mentors, qualified pilots and therefore drone patrols.

This course along with the Jet Ski program will be moving from the SLSWA lifesaving operations to under the club's education umbrella in the future, much the same as the Inflatable Rescue Boat Drivers course.

We had another successful year with good numbers of Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and Bronze candidate's completing the course and becoming very useful contributors to our patrols. A record number of 29 candidates completed their bronze course and have made a huge impact to our patrolling numbers.

Our training equipment was increased this season with the introduction of new manikins with the High Quality cardiopulmonary resuscitation (QCPR) electronic function and App to allow operators to follow their cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) compression and breathing rates. Our newest trainer 'Ruth' was a great help as patient for our Bronze Surf Rescue Certificate and Inflatable Rescue Boat courses.

IRB crew and drivers' courses were successfully run during the winter months.

There were several First aid and advanced resuscitation courses run free to members by SLSWA. It was great to see our members take up these nationally accredited courses and increase our presence on the beach

I would like to thank all our trainers and assessors who without you we could not provide the necessary training to maintain the high level of patrols on our beach.

Another large cohort of Bronze medallion and SRC's was put through their training this season. As in the previous season, over 30 new patrol members joined the ranks on the beach. I would like to thank our Director of Education and trainers for all the effort that goes into building up our numbers on Patrols.

The drone patrol was continued this year. Another cohort of operators has completed the paperwork and online course and is ready to do their practical course with State Surf lifesaving. They will join our existing operators on rostered patrols next season. Drone Patrol operations are carried out as per State Surf Drone Patrol policy requirements, which are framed by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) regulations.

The introduction of the Jet Ski into club lifesaving operations has given our members further opportunities to diversify their skill sets. The Club has upgraded the Jet Ski to a larger one, better suited to operational requirements. State Surf lifesaving has also revamped the Jet Ski course and returned to a 3-tier system of:

- Level 1: Club patrol,
- Level 2: Water safety, and
- Level 3: Search and rescue.

A Level 1 Jet Ski course will be run this year for which the Club has a list of those wanting to do it.

The new patrol tower has been installed. It arrived for the last few weeks of the season as a trial. Next season it will be re-installed for the whole season. Use of the new patrol tower will change the way in which the beach is patrolled. It is expected that Patrols will be coordinated from the tower, leaving two members to observe on the beach at the water's edge between the flags at any one time. The rest of the Patrol members will be mobile, using the IRB or

Jet Ski, carrying out drone operations, or training.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank Patrol Captains and Patrol teams for a great patrol season and keeping our members and the public safe. In meeting our obligation to the Wanneroo Council to provide for beach public safety, on behalf of all patrol members, I would like to thank our Club Captain, Jim Gail, for all the effort that goes into running Patrols and maintaining our operational capability.

I hope you all enjoy the winter break and I look forward to seeing you all on the beach next season.
