President's Report

Any Sporting Club or Corporate Annual report for Season 2019/20 will not escape mention of the Corona Influenza Virus (COVID19).

On 19th March 2020 the QMSLSC Board released an advice to Members that all non-essential Club activities were postponed forthwith. Unfortunately, even though we were only a few short weeks away from the end of the season, all Club activities ceased. Woodside Nippers on Sundays, State Junior and Senior Championships, the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships; all caught the contagion of restrictions imposed by State and Federal authorities.

However, the premature end to Season 2019/20 in no way reflects the reality of the fantastic efforts and great strides that QMSLSC continues to make,

Board Members and Club Officers have their own Report and individual stories to tell but I will briefly mention a few of the outstanding achievements that underpin our progress and endeavour.

- The Woodside Nippers sponsorship package kicked off the season with a 5 year deal to equip, support and develop the Life Savers of tomorrow. Thank you to SLSWA and Woodside for your combined efforts.
- The Club's largest capital works and funding package was undertaken. At the last AGM the Membership approved a \$90,000 program to reconfigure storage, gym and social facilities. This plan came to fruition with an official opening of the function area on 22 February 2020. Thank you to the Building Development Committee who ensured the project was completed in a timely manner and within budget. The program of works was self-funded from the Club's capital expenditure budget.
- The Club purchased a new tractor to support the safe delivery and retrieval of equipment to and from the beach. The tractor has also been utilised to prepare and maintain the beach for Sunday Nippers. Thank you to

Mike Hoy for your diligent commitment to a clean and safe beach.

- Juniors, Seniors and Masters groups continue the upward trend of competition and representation at Club, State and National levels. While COVID 19 meant that we could not perhaps achieve our competition goals for the season, the desire, performance and commitment of Age Managers, Coaches and competitors alike, shows that QMSLSC is a dynamic team in the SLSA movement.
- A new Club Wardrobe of bathers and apparel was introduced following last year's appointment of Nathaniel Lee to the Director of Marketing. Thanks Nat to you and your team for the hard work in setting the agenda for the 'QMSLSC brand'.
- Despite the record capital cost and ongoing operational expenditure, including a new tractor, we remain in a stable financial position. The prudential management of Member funds and the diligent eye on expenditure is a testament to both the current and past Boards.
- Most importantly, the performance of our Life Saving duties in 2019/20 continues to be a strong contributor for our reputation in the areas of Education, Administration and Engagement. Our contract to maintain the safety and well being of all Quinns Beach users is defined by SLSWA and enacted by the City of Wanneroo. We thank both for their strong and ongoing support. However, it is the Bronze and SRC Members who do the heavy lifting. Without your efforts this season, QMSLSC, SLSWA and the City of Wanneroo could not say "We made a difference to lives in our Community". Thank you to our Bronze and SRC Life Savers for the profound impact you have had on your Patrols; Saturdays, Sundays, Public Holidays and Abalone Patrols. Enjoying the amenity is one thing, going home safely is quite another.
- For your continuing support, thank you to our Patron John Quigley, MLA and Attorney General, Vice Patron Mayor Tracey Roberts and Vice Patron (and Patrol Captain) Mark Folkard, MLA.

Finally, thank you to all Members, Club Officers and Volunteers for your support in 2019/20. COVID 19 may isolate but it will not defeat us. QMSLSC is nothing without its Members and we will unite to finish what we started and stand stronger in 2020/21.

Lifesaving Report

Here we are having completed another busy patrol season complete with highs and lows. The club has yet again increased its capacity to provide surf lifesaving services for Quinns Beach, adjacent waters, and adjoining reefs.

With over 100 returning patrol members (up from 80 the previous season) and with a few more experienced patrol members stepping up to take on the Patrol Captain and Vice Captain positions, we were able to put on an additional 2 patrol teams this season, increasing the number of teams to 14 which had the flow on effect of reducing patrol obligations by one less patrol for each patrolling member.

This season also saw us add an additional 23 Bronze Medallion and 31 Surf Rescue Certificate holders to

Among the season highs is the first full season with the new patrol tower. Although introduced just in time for final patrols last season, it was fantastic to finally have a full season with a great and comfortable vantage point from which to watch the beach. This also gave us the opportunity to develop a strategy on what improvements can be made next season to increase it's worth on the beach. All said it was a very welcome change from the mobile lookout tower used in previous seasons.

Also, as the result of the State Government's Recreational Fishing Initiatives Fund, SLSWA was given a grant of \$300,000 over the next 3 years to maintain abalone fisher safety (which FYI was fatality free a second year running). This resulted in a considerable increase of the payment received by the club for the lifesaving support we provided during the four abalone sessions held this season. The need for this support becoming very apparent

during the last abalone session of the season when an abalone fisherman, who got into trouble in the less than perfect conditions, was rescued by Ben Gray and transported back to the club by IRB for further medical treatment – an activity directly involving 5 of our members. It is very rewarding to be recognised for the additional effort we put in to keep our beaches safe.

The low of the season was, as would be expected, the onset of the global COVID-19 pandemic which quickly brought an abrupt end to club activities and reduced the last month of patrols to essential members only. That said, even with reduced beach attendance, our members were called upon to assist police with the retrieval (and subsequent arrest) of a person of interest from the waters near Eden Beach. Even with the world having gone into shutdown, our services were still required and we were able to assist.

With regards to individual patrol statistics, following is the rankings of the 14 patrol teams as a ratio of rostered patrol hours vs patrol hours actually recorded - an individual’s recorded patrol time starts when they report to the patrol area and stops when they finish their patrol duties for the day. This captures the teams who members are arriving early to check equipment in preparation for their patrol or staying back to ensure everything is cleaned, replenished, and packed away ready for the next patrol. It also captures patrols whose members arrange substitutes in the event they are unable to attend.

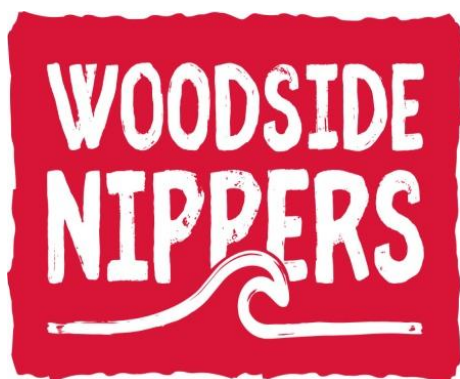

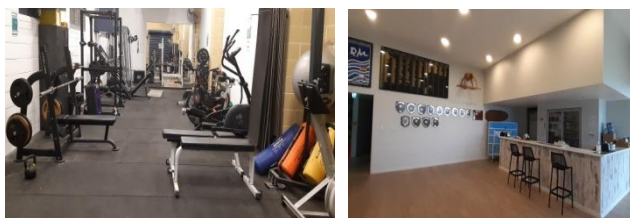
